It is based in Gasaka Sector-Nyamagabe District-Southern Province and operated in 3 Districts namely Nyamagabe, Nyaruguru and Nyamasheke with more than 10,000 beneficiaries.

Through IPC, Citizens' participation was strengthened by means of its methodology build on 6 steps:

- Step 1. Collection of Citizens' priorities.
- Step 2. Compilation of Citizens' priorities.
- Step 3. Analysis of imihigo (Vis a vis DDS, etc and Considered priorities Vs Non- Considered ones).
- Step 4. Dissemination and feedback to the citizens.
- Step 5. Monitoring of imihigo (Mid-term evaluation).
- Step 6. Final participatory imihigo evaluation (Citizens' perceptions & level of achievements).

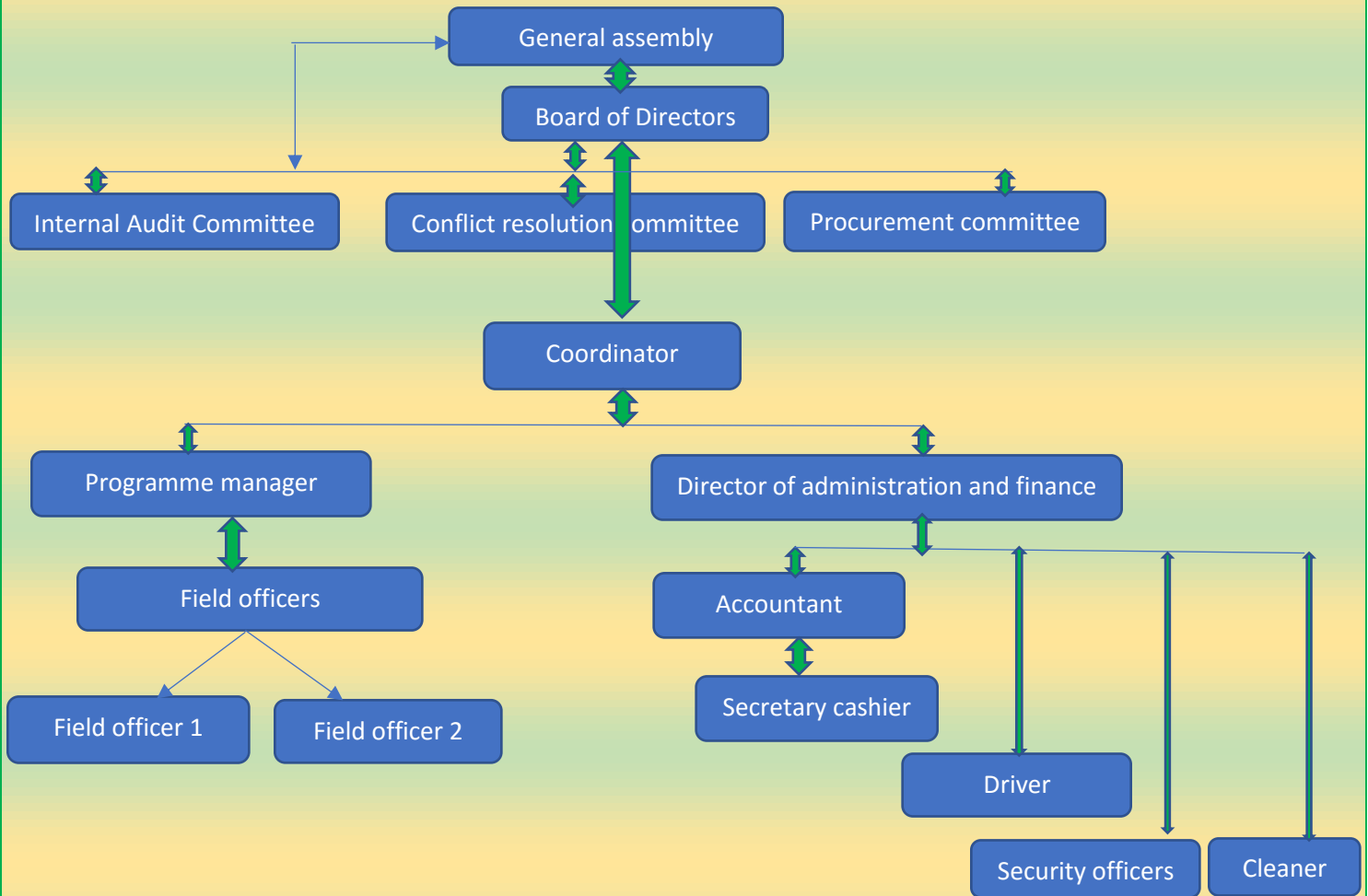
